•All connecting flights from Kuantan Airport/Kuala Lumpur airport should depart after 2030hrs/1900hrs respectively.

•One is required to go through Immigration and customs procedures while crossing from Malaysia to Singapore or vice versa and change of vehicles either licensed for Malaysia or Singapore.

•Local State Taxes and the Tourism Tax or both, ranging from RM 2 to RM 10 per room per night are payable direct to the hotel.

Day 01 – Sun – Singapore – Johor Bahru – Malacca (250 Km)

Meet at departure point – Parkroyal on Pickering at 0800hrs and depart to Malacca.Tour the historic sites such as Cheng Hoon Teng Temple, Kampung Kling Mosque, Jonker Street with its antiques and curios, Baba Nyonya Heritage Museum, the pink Stadhuy’s Building, Malacca Clock Tower, Christchurch and the famous Porta de Santiago.

Day 02 – Mon – Malacca – Kuala Lumpur (147 km)

Early morning depart to Kuala Lumpur. Tour the King’s Palace (photo stop), National Mosque & Railway Station, National Monument, Independence Square, Sultan Abdul Samad building (photo stop), Selangor Club (photo stop), St Mary’s Church, the world’s tallest free-standing flagpole and Seri Mahamariamman Temple. Enjoy some bargain hunting at Chinatown. From the tallest Communication Tower in South East Asia, enjoy a panoramic view of the city.

Day 03 – Tue – Kuala Lumpur

Today visit the Royal Selangor Visitor center, the world’s largest pewter manufacturer, which makes appealing and good quality souvenirs. Be amazed at Batu Caves – the holy, sacred cave temple for the Hindus (except 3 days of pre and post during Thaipusam festival) and lastly visit a batik factory.

Day 04 – Wed – Kuala Lumpur – Cameron Highlands (220 km)

After breakfast, drive North towards Cameron Highland stopping en-route at Lata Iskandar Waterfall and a native settlement. Tour the Highlands visiting the tea plantation, tea factory (factory operations is closed on Mon & public holidays), market place and butterfly farm.

Day 05 – Thu – Cameron Highlands – Penang (330 km)

Early morning set off to Penang. Stop at the Royal town of Kuala Kangsar. View the Ubudiah Mosque, the attractive Iskandariah Palace and Istana

Kenangan, built without a single nail. Discover the rich history of the Royal Town of Kuala Kangsar on a river cruise. Visit to a notable blacksmith in town for its modern and contemporary sculptor making. Inspired by traditional forging he turns iron pieces into artistic metal sculptures. Continue visit the Labu Sayong Center where unique shaped pots are made with deft hands and creative inspirations mostly by womenfolk.

Cross over to Penang, the “Pearl of the Orient” via one of the longest bridge in the world.

Day 06 – Fri – Discovery Tour of Georgetown, Penang

Today visit the 3rd longest reclining Buddha figure in the world followed by Kek Lok Si Temple, the Temple of 1000 Buddhas. Visit Fort Cornwallis, the water village of The Clan Jetties at Weld Quay and “The Street of Harmony” where churches, Chinese temples, mosques and Hindu temples harmonious exist side by side. Be amazed by the intricate Khoo Kong Si clan’s house. Enjoy a breezy trishaw ride. The rest of the day is free to spend at leisure.

Day 07 – Sat – Penang – Kota Bharu (400 km)

Today, travel from the west to the east of Peninsular Malaysia through the main mountain range, take in breathtaking views of the dense tropical rain forest. En route, rest at Banding Island with its scenic view of Temenggor Lake. Continue to Kota Bharu, Kelantan, a friendly small town.

Day 08 – Sun – Kota Bharu – Kuala Terengganu (170 km)

This morning visit the famous and colourful famous wet market of Kota Bharu. Witness the traditional lifestyle of villagers such as silver handicraft, songket weaving and the traditional Wau (kite) making. Enjoy the scenic drive along the coastline southward towards Kuala Terengganu. Enjoy some delectable local chips made of fish or prawn. See a monkey plucking coconuts. The rest of the afternoon is free to spend at leisure.

Day 09 – Mon – Kuala Terengganu – Kuantan (250 km)

Drive further South towards Kuantan. En-route visit Pulau Duyong, famous traditional boat making. Explore the Islamic Civilization showcasing twenty replicas of great Islamic monuments of the world. Taste the popular Malay delicacy of this region, “lemang”, rice cooked with coconut milk in bamboo.

Visit scenic coastal fishing villages and a turtle information Centre. Enjoy a local tea break. Visit the

Batik Gallery, Malaysia’s famous art textile made from wax, using hand-drawn or hand-blocked technique.

Day 10 – Tue – Kuantan – Singapore (400 km)

Early morning heads towards Singapore. En-route visit the Royal Town of Pekan. Explore the traditional boat museum. ETA in Singapore is at 1800 hrs.

An active holiday exploring the different facets of Malaysia’s nature, culture and unique sights. Mingle with local villagers and explore a pristine tropical rainforest at Belum National Park.

Day 01 – Mon, Wed, Fri – KUL – Batu Caves – Kuala Selangor (75 km) [L/D]
Meet at the lobby at 9.00am for a leisure drive Kuala Selangor Nature Park. On-route visit the famous Batu Caves. A flight of 272 steps leads up to a sacred Hindu Temple.

Explore Kota Melawati and Kuala Selangor Nature Park, if you are lucky, you may spot wild silver-leaf monkeys.

Enjoy a local lunch at a malay village and mingle with the villagers. Be entranced with a boat ride to see thousands of fireflies put on a dazzling display of lights, with their synchronous flickering.

Day 02 – Tue, Thu, Sat – Kuala Selangor – Cameron Highlands (199 km) [B]
Enjoy a 3.5 hrs drive to the Cameron Highland. Visit the Lata Iskandar Waterfall and a native settlement.

Explore in your highland tour, the tea plantation, tea factory (factory operations is closed on Mon & public holidays), the market place, a vegetable farm, a flower garden and the butterfly farm.

Day 03 – Wed, Fri, Sun –Cameron Highlands – Ipoh (90 km) [B]
Explore Ipoh, with its old world charm and burgeoning hipster cafe. Visit the Perak Tong Cave, Ipoh Railway Station, St Michael Old Building, Ipoh Royal Club, Ipoh High Court and shop for some tasty local products.

Day 04 – Thur, Sat, Mon – Ipoh – Kuala Sepetang – Taiping – Bukit Merah (119 km)[B]
At the royal town of Kuala Kangsar view Malaysia’s unique architecture of the exterior of Ubudiah Mosque, Iskandariah Palace and Kenangan.

Visit the fishing village of Kuala Sepetang and a charcoal kiln in Malaysia’s best-managed mangrove forests. View the first railway station and enjoy a boat cruise and observe daily activities and life of the coastal fishing folk. Marvel at the tranquil and lush Taiping Lake.

Day 05 – Fri, Sun, Tues Bukit Merah – Orang Utan Island – Belum Valley (189 km) [B]
Enjoy a 10-minute boat ride across calm waters to the Orang Utan Island, a center dedicated to the rehabilitation and conservation of Malaysia's orangutans before departing to Belum Valley.

Day 06 – Sat, Mon, Wed – Belum Valley [B]
Discover Belum Valley, an area bristling with fauna and flora, a rich national heritage. A boat ride takes you to a aboriginal villages to observe and mingle with the ‘Orang Asli’ people, which literally mean ‘the original people’. Enjoy a jungle trek and with some luck, find the ‘Rafflesia’ – the world’s largest flower in the wilderness. Relax at a scenic waterfall in the lush green jungle. Rest of the day is free at leisure.

Day 07 – Sun, Tues, Thur – Belum Valley – Alor Setar (187 km) [B/L]
Enjoy your journey to Alor Star – the capital of Malaysia’s oldest Malay Sultanate. Explore the bustling Wednesday Market (which interestingly enough, is open daily). Enjoy a breathtaking view at Alor Star Tower for a panoramic view of vast expanses of paddy fields. Enjoy your lunch “in the clouds”. View Masjid Zahir from the exterior, one of the grandest and most beautiful mosques in Malaysia, the Balai Besar or Balai Penghadapan (audience hall), Balai Nobat, a unique building that houses the sacred instruments of royal orchestra and the Kedah Royal Museum. Explore the Rice Museum.

Day 08 – Mon, Wed, Fri – Alor Setar – Penang (118 km) [B]
Discover the Culture and Heritage of Georgetown, which has been official declared as a UNESCO SITE in 2008. Visit Kek Lok Si Temple the most beautiful and largest Buddhist temple complex in South East Asia. Visit Fort Cornwallis, the landing site of Captain Francis Light in 1786. Explore the water village of the Clan Jetties at Weld Quay. The walkway follows a roughly rectangular shape and crosses a river twice. Visitors will enjoy an exciting and fun-filled day in the natural wonders of Sedim River. Transfer in the late afternoon for your ferry ride back to Langkawi Island accompanied by our local guide, expected arrival at Kuah jetty is at 1900hrs.

Day 01 – Kuching
Meet upon arrival at the Airport and transfer to hotel in the city of Kuching. Explore on your own the quaint city by foot or take a sampan (boat) along the Sarawak River

long-tailed macaques, monitor lizards, estuarine crocodiles (crocodylus porosus) and birds such as kingfishers, white-bellied eagles, various wading birds and the very rare Lesser Adjutant Stork.

Day 04 – Saloma Village Stay – Kuching (279 km) [B/L]

Depending on the tide (morning or afternoon), enjoy a boat ride to the estuarine of Santubong River and the Salak Rivers. The saline mangroves has an extensive network of waterways and tidal creeks, go in search of diverse wildlife including proboscis monkeys,

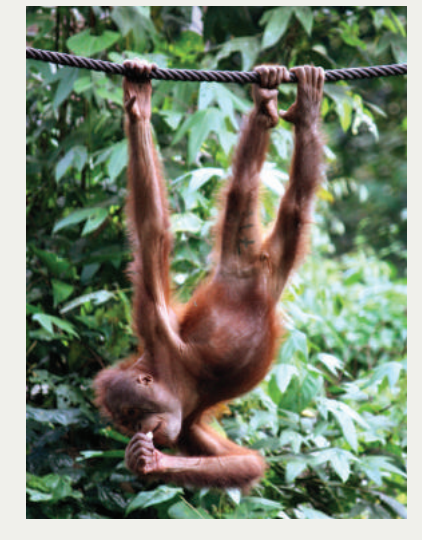

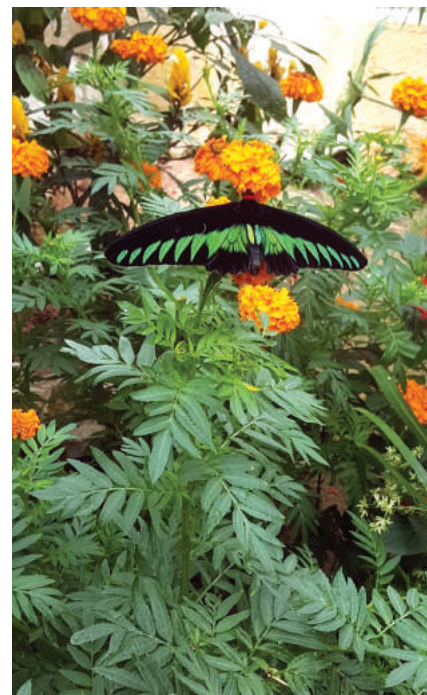

Explore a Rungus longhouse, the Rungus natives are known for their beads and basket-weaving handicraft. Enjoy the spectacular sunset at the northern most tip of Borneo, overlooking the South China Sea with a glass of wine.

Day 07 – Kudat – Kota Kinabalu (179 km) [B]
En-route to Kota Kinabalu stop at a gong making village, a Rungus tribe musical instrument and a village to see how the local honey is produced. Rest of the day in Kota Kinabalu is at leisure.

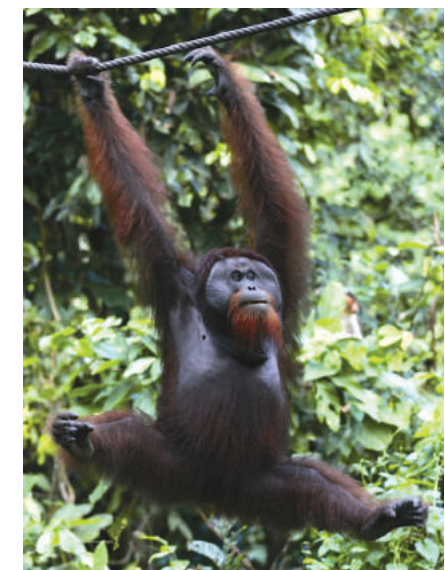

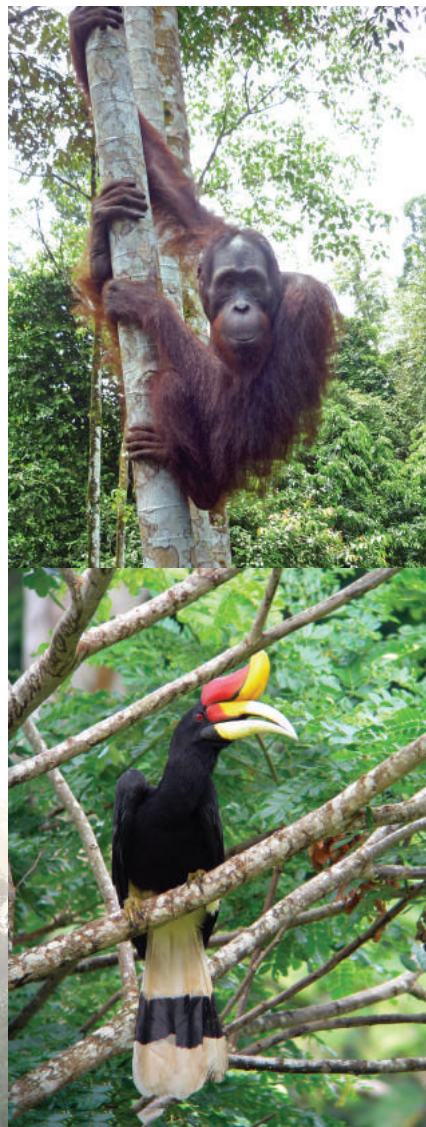

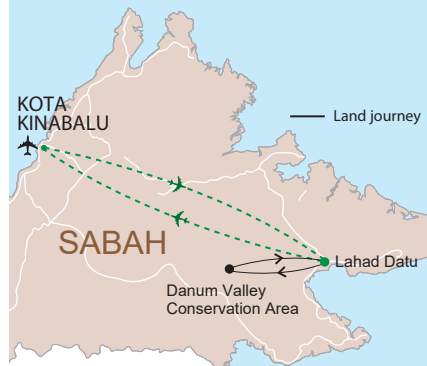

Day 01 – Kota Kinabalu – Telupid Town– Deramakot Forest Reserve (250 km) [L/D]
Pick up at 0900 hrs and enjoy a 4.5 hrs journey to Telupid Town. From there embark on a four-wheel drive vehicle for another 2-hours to Deramakot Forest Reserve on paved and gravel road. After a briefing on the lodge’s facilities, go on a wildlife drive to set up camera traps used for monitoring the number and types of wildlife.

At night, go for a 2 hrs, 4x4 night safari in search of nocturnal wildlife. Deramakot is home for varieties of wildlife including the rare Clouded Leopard. Overnight in a dormitory.

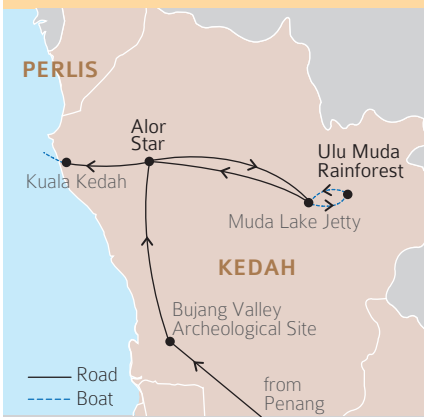

Day 01 – Overland Penang – Bujang Valley – Alor Star 148 km)
Depart from Penang to the renowned Bujang Valley. Upon arriving at Bujang Valley, be amazed by the wonders of Malaysia’s earliest civilization at the Lembah Bujang Archeological Museum that serves evidence of a vibrant trading centre of a prosperous kingdom that once existed.

Visit the bustling Pekan Rabu or Wednesday Market (which interestingly, is open daily) in Alor Star. Enjoy a panoramic view of the Straits of Malacca and the vast expanses of paddy fields from the Alor Star Tower. In the Rice Museum (Muzium Padi) to learn how Kedah produces the largest rice harvest in the country.

Visit Sira Bonggor or Sira Keladi, for a good introduc-tion to trekking in the rainforest. If you are lucky, you could spot the Asian elephant, guar, tapir, deer, wild boar Malayan tiger, panther, clouded leopard amongst others.

Relax with a river cruise in search of wildlife. (Sightings of wildlife is not guaranteed).

Day 03 – In Ulu Muda Rainforest [B/L/D]
Experience a two hrs relatively easy trek through the pristine jungle to Bukit Labu (Labu Hill), a newly discovered limestone hill with several caves.

Enjoy a simple lunch by a cool, wide stream and a casual walk in search of Ulu Muda’s abundant avifauna and other wildlife. Ulu Muda is listed by Birdlife International as an important bird watching area. A home to many rare and globally threatened bird species include the very rare Plain –pouched Hornbill, Masked Finfoot, and the Argus Pheasant,

Ulu Muda has recorded sightings of over 300 species of birds and still counting!

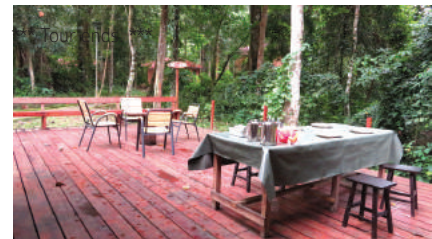
After dinner, enjoy river cruise ride in search of wildlife

Day 4 – In Ulu Muda Rainforest [B/L/D]
Take a short boat ride to Kuala Batu salt lick, on-route, visit the wild honey collection area where you may see honey collectors climbing up Tualang trees that can reach up to 85 meters harvesting honey in a traditional method that is sustainable for both the honey collectors and the bees.

Enjoy lunch by the Muda. Take a dip in the water, or relax. Journey back to the Lodge floating along the river on inflated rubber tubes. A quiet and relaxing way to travel that gives you a better chance of spotting wildlife. The rest of the afternoon is free at leisure.

At night, go for another river cruise in search of wildlife

Day 05 - Ulu Muda Rainforest – Kuala Kedah Jetty [B/L]
Visit the Ayer Hangat Hot Spring Saltlick before returning to Muda Lake Jetty and Kuala Kedah Jetty to board your ferry to Langkawi.

Pioneered in 1975 by our founder, Anthony Wong this tour gives you an opportunity to go into areas less frequented in Taman Negara trekking through virgin forest, experiencing Mother Nature at her best overnighting in quiet and pristine areas when in the jungle.

Day 01 – Mon, Wed, Fri – Kuala Lumpur – Kuala Tembeling (200 km) – Taman Negara [D]
Meet at the lobby between 07.30am to 07.45am to be transferred to the shuttle coach for your 4 hrs journey to Kuala Tembeling jetty where you will register with the National Park and Wildlife Department.

Enjoy your 3 hrs boat journey passing by local villages and lush tropical rainforest to the National Park, Taman Negara. Spot kingfishers, hornbills, monkeys, monitor lizards or water buffaloes along the river.

Upon arrival at the park, meet your local nature guide and proceed to Dedari.

Your first adventure will be a 2 hours night jungle walk in the 130 million years old tropical rainforest with your nature guide and a Bateq tribesmen. Lookout for nocturnal insects amidst the chorus of the rainforest.

Day 2 – Tue, Thu, Sat-Kuala Tahan – Kuala Keniam – Kepayang Cave [B/L/D]
Enjoy a 1.5 hrs boat ride and depart for your adventure in a 6 hrs jungle trek to Kepayang Cave with your nature specialist guide who will enlighten you on the jungle eco system, identify unique plants, some which are with medicinal properties. If you are lucky, you may see wild elephants. En-route visit the Dancing Leave Cave and Luas Cave. Enjoy another night walk in this pristine area where chances of spotting animals are higher. Experience the bygone caveman days as you overnigh tonight in a cave.

Day 3 – Wed, Fri, Sun-Kepayang Cave-Kumbang Hide [B/L/D]
Embark on another 6 hours trek through the virgin forest to experience more of the national park. See some of the magnificent tualang trees which can be up to 85 metres tall. Rest of the day, at leisure for you to swim or just relax. Overnight at Kumbang Hide, a very basic hut on stilts overlooking the natural saltlick for the best possibility of animal observation. Shared toilet, sleeping bag and karrimat, no fan, no aircon and bathing in the river.

Day 4 – Thu, Sat, Mon-Kumbang Hide– Batek Native Village [B/L/D]
Your last trek will be a 1.5 hrs to Kuala Trenggan and from there enjoy a short boat ride to the Bateq Jungle Hut. In the late afternoon, visit a Bateq Native Village. Local lunch Bateq style, enjoy some jungle food that was gathered. In the afternoon learn about their simple and peaceful life of sharing and other interesting cultural beliefs in Dedari Village.

Overnight at the Bateq Jungle Hut. (Basic facilities)

Day 5 – Fri, Sun, Tue-Kuala Terenggan-Kuala Tahan-Kuala Lumpur (276 km) [B]
Enjoy the last morning in this pristine virgin forest before taking a short boat ride to Kuala Tahan where you will overland back to Kuala Lumpur City arriving at approximately 06.00 pm.

Day 01 – Kota Kinabalu – Kinabalu Park (90 km) [L/D]
0800hrs enjoy a 2 ¼ hours journey to Kinabalu National Park. The Park covers an area of 754 sq km and is 1623 metres above sea level. Within its boundaries, you will find lowland rain forest at its lower level, montane vegetation at its medium level and conifers and other alpine flora at the summit.

Enjoy a video presentation of the Park, take a leisure guided mountain garden walk. In the late afternoon, you can either relax and enjoy the tropical scenery or explore the many nature trails before settling in for dinner. Overnight at local lodge or Park accommodation.


Day 02 – Summit of Mount Kinabalu [B/L/D]
Proceed to the Power Station at 1829 meters and from there begin your trek on the summit trail. Along the way, boxed lunch will be served. Look out for wild

Day 01 – Kuala Lumpur – Taman Negara (214 km) [D]
At 0730hrs, overland transfer to Labu Sentral Jetty. Upon arrival, take a boat ride at 11.30hrs from Labu Sentral to the national park. After check-in, rest at the resort.
In this afternoon, enjoy an excursion to the Lata Berkoh. There is a small pool delightful for swimming or resting on the rocky area overlooking the river. The boat will drift along the river quietly in search of wild birds and animals. However, sighting of wildlife is not guaranteed.

Day 02 – Taman Negara [B,PL,D]
Explore and experience the nomadic life of the Bateq tribesmen, how they co-exist with the jungle as their home, as they gather food, find medicinal plants and other native lifestyle activities. Learn about their survival skills. Packed lunch is included.
In the afternoon learn about their simple and peaceful life of sharing and other interesting cultural beliefs in Dedari Village.

Day 03 – Taman Negara – Jerantut (67km) [B,L]
Enjoy a 1 ½ hours trek up Teresek Hill and be rewarded with a panoramic view of the tropical rainforest at the top. Adventure with a canopy walkway (closed on Thursday), built 40 meters above the ground and 530 meters in length for a “on top of the world” experience, amongst the lush rainforest.
After lunch at the resort, check-out & take a boat ride to cross the Tahan River. Your driver will wait for you at the Kuala Tahan Jetty for transfer to Jerantut. Upon arrival, check in to hotel and relax. Sleep early tonight as you will check out from hotel as early as 0330hrs on the following day.

Day 04 – Jerantut – Wakaf Bharu (by Jungle Train) – Kota Bharu (5km) – Pasir Belanda (7km)
At 0330hrs, check-out and transfer to Jerantut Train station. You will take a Jungle train to Wakaf Bharu at 0428hrs with 10 times stopping at various stations on the way to Wakaf Bahru.
Train will be arrived at Wakaf Bharu train Station around 1214hrs (Please take note that train delays aren’t uncommon). Your driver will meet you at the station and take you to a local restaurant for lunch (at own expenses).

After lunch, proceed to Gelanggang Seni, the town’s cultural center and where you should head for this region’s dose of Malay tradition. You’ll be able to see top spinning, silat martial arts demonstration and kite making or join in the chicken-feather-ball game.
After that, proceed to Warung Pak Mat Pulau Pisang for afternoon tea. The famous menu is Teh Tarik Madu @ Honey Tea with bubbles and fish soup. Continue to Pasir Belanda Resort for overnight.

Day 05 – Pasir Belanda - Kuala Besar (6km) – Pasir Belanda [B]
Your first day of cycling. You will set out from Pasir Belanda and cycle on small village trails to Kuala Besar and come back to Pasir Belanda. Visit to a local kite maker, fish cracker factories and a World War II bunker will make this journey unforgettable. There is 02 route option either used all road or you can choose to cross the Kelantan river by local boat (boat fees is at own expenses).

Day 06 – Pasir Belanda – Tumpat (27km) [B]
You will cycle from Pasir Belanda to your home stay address in Tumpat. The Tumpat area is situated on the other side of the Kelantan river and you need to take a ferry to get there. Here’s where you find lots of Thai temples with colorful decorations like the Wat Photivihan, Wat Machimmaram and Wat Pikulthong. Have a good look out for rattan furniture factories. It’s interesting to see what they can make out of this local grown species of rattan. You’ll spend the night in a traditional village house near Tumpat town.

Day 07 – Tumpat - Kota Bharu (16km) [B]
Have a look around in the old heritage town of Tumpat. In the past this town was a hub for sailors and it’s harbour was used as a storage place for export goods. When you climb the old lighthouse, you’ll have a nice view of the natural harbour of Tumpat and railway station. You can also make a detour if you would like to visit the Thai border to do some shopping there. Visit a Wayang Kulit maker (Shadow Puppets) and a Serunding factory (dried and spiced meat floss) before you cross over by ferry to Kota Bharu.

Tour will end at Pasir Belanda Resort. You can choose either to overnight at Pasir Belanda or transfer to Kota Bharu Airport for flight your next destination.

Day 01 – Kuching – Sarikei (Ulu Sarikei) – Sibu (338 km) [L]
Your adventure starts at 0700 hrs with a transfer to the ferry terminal to board the local express boat (not accompanied by guide) for a 3.5 hrs ride to Sarikei. Enjoy the riverside scenery of small towns and longhouses along the Batang Rejang River. Meet your local guide at Sarikei and overland to Ulu Sarikei passing scenic views of hilly landscapes, pepper vineyards, rubber tree estates, paddy fields, and longhouses.

At Ulu Sarikei longhouse, walk and discover the longhouse with nearby the countryside, farm and clear water stream (subject to weather condition). Prepare and enjoy BBQ lunch along the clear water stream. Follow the villagers to experience local rubber tapping activity.

Head up to Sibu, known as the Heart of Sarawak. Explore the fascinating Night Market.

Day 02 – Sibu – Sungai Kut – Dalat – Oya – Mukah (244 km) [B/D]
Discover Sibu’s rich heritage in a walking tour. Visit the century-old Tua Peng Kong temple, the beautiful Seven Storey Pagoda (Kuan Ying), Sibu’s oldest commodities trading point and wharf also known as the “Floating Market”, Sibu Heritage Centre, a compilation of Sibu history, local ethnic and cultures, lifestyle and traditions and lastly, the biggest Central Market in Malaysia, which consists of 1,200 stalls and varieties of commodities including jungle produce.

Enjoy a 1½-hour speedboat ride to Dalat, cruising through the mighty Rajang and Igan River passing Malay villages, shipyards, timber & sago processing factories, Iban longhouses and Melanau village that bring you back to the feel of the ancient Sarawak when water transportation played a significant role. En-route stops at peaceful Sungai Kut Melanau Village for a walk.

Continue to Dalat by passing through the rainforest and mangrove. On the last part of the speedboat journey from Sungai Kut depending on the tide, you may have to be transferred by a 15 minutes overland journey to Dalat. Upon arrival in Dalat, visit a Church by the River & the Dalat Icon – The Jerunei Garden. Enjoy your overland trip to Mukah passing through the serene and picturesque town of Oya.

Check into the Lamin Dana, a semi traditional Melanau house overlooking the river at Mukah. Go for a village walk and learn about the mystical past beliefs of the Melanau community by visiting the burial grounds of ancient Jerunei. Enjoy an exotic Melanau Dinner. If weather permits, watch the tiny twinkling orangey fireflies among the trees in Lamin Dana. Overnight in Lamin Dana.

Day 03 – Mukah – Bintulu (150 km) [B/L]
Take another boat ride along the Tellian River and Misan River. Visit a local sago processing centre in the cottage industry of producing Sago Pearls in a traditional method. Visit a sago bake house to see how sago is being baked into sago pearls for local consumption and export.
**Note: Sago processing factory & sago bake house are closed on Sunday.*

Continue the boat ride to Mukah River and visit the Mukah market where you may encounter exotic food like the sago Worm, Umai (fresh raw fish similar to sushi) and others.

Return to Lamin Dana and Melanau where lunch will be served. Bid farewell to the locals and proceed overland to Bintulu using the only cross division road. Rest of the day is free at leisure in Bintulu.

Day 04 – Bintulu – Niah National Park - Miri (225 km) [B]
Explore the spectacular Niah National Park. Take the longboat ride at Pangkalan Lobang to cross the river where we will start off with a visit to the Niah Museum.

The oldest human remains were found in Niah making the park one of the most important archaeological sites of the world.

Tour of the cave will take you through the Great and Painted Caves as well as allowing you to witness the age-old remnants of bird’s nest harvesting equipment inside the cave (now a government-controlled activity).

Day 05 – Miri [B]
Free at leisure until departure transfer to the airport for your onward flight.

Visit the Kenyah, by 4-wheel-drive (45mins) to Lio Mato Village. Explore the village, witness the century-old fort which commands a panoramic view of upper Baram River, and visit the village school. Continue with another hour drive to visit Apau Ubi Sela'an, a 4-family farm-house. Explore the garden, tour the farm-house, and get involved with their daily chores while lunch is prepared and served.

Day 03 – Sela'an Linau Waterfall Trekking [B/L/D]
A day of Nature Retreat right in the heart of Borneo Wilderness, rejuvenating in the pools of Sela'an



Waterfall at a drop of 100+ meters. Approximately 45mins drive followed by 45mins trek to the secluded and spectacular spot in the midst of the dense dipterocarp forest. Swim, relax and rejuvenate while a traditional "Pansuh" lunch with food cooked in bamboo is prepared.

Day 04 – Long Sait – Sepigan (Penan Village) – Segah Sela'an [B/PL/D]
Visit to a small settlement at Long Sait. Upon arrival, embark on a thrilling journey in a long-tailed boat for a 40mins to Sepigan (Penan) Village, located at the upper reaches of Selungo River, a tributary of the mighty Baram. Explore the village, their garden of medicinal and edible plants. Participate in their craftworks.

Day 05 – Departure to Miri [B]
After breakfast, pack and depart back to Miri via 4WD/Maswing and transfer to the airport for flight departure.

Meet & greet in Sibu and then transfer to your hotel for check in.

In the afternoon, proceed for a walking tour of the Sibu Central Market (biggest in Malaysia), Sibu Heritage Museum and the Pagoda. In the evening, briefing over dinner before exploring the Night Market. Return to your hotel after the walk.

Day 02 – Sibu - Bario – Kapit [B]
Walk to the Sibu Boat Terminal for a 2½-hour exciting express boat journey to Kapit, a small township dominated by Ibans and Chinese, along the bank of Rejang River. Upon arrival at Kapit, proceed to visit the Resident's Office to obtain the Permit for remote travel. Rest of the day you will visit Fort Sylvia, Kapit Museum and Teresang native market.

Day 03 – Kapit – Kejaman Longhouse Belaga [B/D]
Leave for Belaga by express boat for about 3 hours negotiating the infamous Pelagus Rapids. Upon arrival in Belaga Town, continue the journey by longboat (about 1½ hours depending on the water level) to go further upriver to visit a Kejaman Longhouse. Upon arrival, tour the longhouse and its surroundings to observe their lifestyle, witness their

daily chores, most notably the ancient burial pole of their paramount chiefs. Evening, dinner followed by witnessing the Kejaman welcome dance. Overnight in the Kejaman longhouse.

Day 04 – Belaga [B/L/D]
Start the day with a longhouse hopping spree in a longboat visiting the Kayan, Lahanan and Sekapan Tribes. These are part of the vanishing tribes least heard of by tourist and live-in small communities that even the locals have very little or no knowledge of them. Along the boat journey, take a vigilant surveillance of the mystical sights of the Keliriengs and Salongs (Ancient burial grounds) of the Orang Ulu, dotting the tropical rainforest alongside the gigantic Rejang. Have lunch in one of the longhouses. Conclude the day with dinner, witnessing Datun Julud, a traditional rhythmic hornbill welcome dance and overnight at a Kenyah Longhouse Village.

Day 05 – Belaga – Sibu [B/D]
Depart for Sibu by express boat. Check in to hotel and rest of the day, free at leisure. Farewell dinner at a local restaurant. Overnight in the hotel.

Day 06 – Departure Sibu [B]
Free and easy until checkout/pick up for transfer to Sibu Airport for your onwards journey. The tour ends

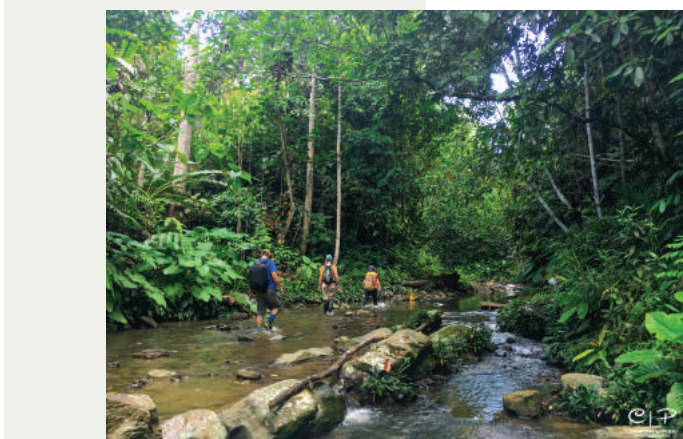

Day 01 – Arrival in Miri [D]
Meet with guide in Miri and proceed for City orientation tour. There will be time for some last-minute shopping to get supplies and there will be a briefing of what the next couple of days have in store. In the evening, dinner and overnight.

Day 02 – Miri – Segah Sela'an Linau [B/L/D]
Starts journey by 4-Wheel Drive (4WD) to Kedaya Telang Usan (Baram Upper River). The drive takes approximately 2 hours on tar road from Miri City to Lapok Town and another 4 Hours on logging road with short break along the way. Enjoy the scenic view of green mountain & forest. Late afternoon arrive at Segah Sela'an Homestay.

Day 03 – Segah Sela'an Linau – Ba'Ajeng Village [B/L/D]
The boat ride from Long Segah to Ba'Ajeng will take about 1 to 2 hours depending on water level at the day. Enjoy the beauty and the serenity of Ulu Baram by small boat after a long 4WD journey. Upon arrival at Ba' Ajeng, meet and greet with your host. Free to explore the surrounding area and chit-chat with the community.
** Overnight at Ba' Ajeng Village & please bring your own sleeping bag/Sleeping mat.

Day 04-05 – Ba'Ajeng Village [B/L/D]
Spend the next 2 days with the hosts, learn about the way of life of the Penan people and their native skills and knowledge such as the vast array of medicinal and edible plants in the forest, and how to make the infamous blow pipes and poison darts! Will have the opportunity to assist in the planting of saplings in the forest, take walks into the jungle to swim in nearby

waterfalls and simply relax in a beautiful environment surrounded by nature. Food will be simple, healthy, and organic. Expect lots of rice and wonderful jungle vegetables such as jungle fern and wild ginger flower. The Penan people make some of the best quality and beautifully designed rattan baskets and mats in Sarawak, and as a memento of your trip there is no better place to buy.

Day 06-08 – Jungle Trekking [B/L/D]
Start an exciting 3 days/2nights of jungle trekking, exploration and sleeping in expedition standard hammocks under the canopy of one of the oldest rainforests on Earth and the traditional home of the Penan tribe who remain the jungle experts of Borneo and 'keepers of the rainforest'. Expect to be trekking between 4-5 hours each day while learning all about basic jungle survival skills, how to build shelters, finding safe drinking water and food and starting fires. Each night will be a new campsite and you will be expected to carry your own kit and expedition hammocks as we make our way through the jungle trails.

Day 08 – Ba' Lamam Village – Long Segah [B/L/D]
After breakfast, bid farewell with your friends and hosts before continuing journey back by boat to Long Segah Sela'an. Overnight at Segah Sela'an homestay

Day 09 – Depart Long Segah– Long Akah Airport [B]
Early Morning, after breakfast, farewell to your hosts then transfer by 4WD to Long Akah airport for your connecting flight back to Miri then to the next destination.

Today, we will visit the mangrove forest of Kuala Selangor Nature Park. Mangrove is a very unique ecosystem, which is influenced by the rise and fall of the tides. Here we target to see a unique list including Mangrove Whistler, Mangrove Blue Flycatcher, Mangrove Pitta, Lesser Adjutants, Painted Stork, Eagles (Created Serpent & White-bellied), Brahmany Kite, Black Baza, Red Junglefowl and etc. Kuala Selangor is part of an Important Bird Area (IBA) and is good for its waders and waterbirds. Common sightings during the migration season end Sept-March would include Plovers, Whimbrel, Redshank, Curlew Sandpiper, Terns or etc. The area also includes a visit to the coastal mudflats and paddyfields to cover birds from a variety of habitats.

Depart to Kuala Kubu Baru/Selangor Dam, opportunistic birding along the way. Upon arrival, check-in. Exciting birds ahead.



Fraser's Hill (also part of an IBA) for highland & lower montane birds. Here we will spend the next 3 days in birding heaven. At Fraser's Hill we will get to see about 50-70 species and we will hope to catch good views of mostly sunda (and Malaysian) endemics i.e. Malaysian Hill Partridge, Laughingthrush, Whistling Thrush. Other targets include Marbled Wren Babbler, Blyths Hawk-Eagle, Blue-crowned Hanging-Parrot, Green-billed Malkoha, Brown Wood-Owl, Red-bearded Bee-eater and etc.

Day 05 -Fraser Hill [B]
Fraser's Hill Birding. Overnight at hotel.

Day 06 - Fraser Hill [B]

Our adventure concludes at one of South East Asia's finest national park – Taman Negara. It is the most favoured birding destination for Peninsula Malaysia to primarily get the fantastic lowland birds. Sitting amidst towering rainforest trees and among the oldest rainforests and the Tahan River, it is a gem of a site that will be your base for the next 3 days of fantastic birding. The lowland rainforest at Taman Negara is home to over 240 species of birds and we will try for gems such as White-crowned Hornbill, Rhinoceros Hornbills, Blue-banded Kingfisher, Malayan Peacock Pheasant, Crested Fireback, Green Broadbill, Thick-billed Green Pigeon, Blue-eared Barbet, Asian Fairy Bluebird, Blue-winged Leafbird and many others and if we are very lucky the elusive Great Argus.

Day 08 - Taman Negara [B]
Taman Negara Birding. Overnight at hotel.

Day 09 - Taman Negara [B]
Taman Negara Birding. Overnight at hotel.

Breakfast at staying hotel. Free at leisure till your departure transfer to airport.

Day 02 – Georgetown [B]
Proceed for Georgetown Heritage Cycling Tour. The well-preserved cultural and historical heritage of Penang's capital city is full of color and life. You'll explore the most historic streets in George Town, traditional trades and taste delicious hawkers foods. Your guided cycling tour travels to St. George's Church, Hock Teik Cheng Sin Temple, Sri Mariamman Temple, Kapitan Keling Mosque, Pinang Peranakan Mansion, Armenian Street and Muntri Street. Visit one of the local products outlets and learn about native ingredients, age-old recipes and traditional cooking techniques before savoring a taste of aromatic Malay dishes, delectable Chinese cuisine and spicy Indian fare.

Day 03 – Penang – Taiping (98km) [B]
After breakfast, overland to Taiping. After check-in into hotel and took some needed rest, we do some early evening birding around the hotel grounds and surrounding areas. Potential Bird: Scarlet-backed Flowerpecker, Black-caped Kingfisher, Chestnut-breasted Malkoha, Oriental Pied Magpie, Red-eyed Bulbul, Hill Myna, Gerygone, White-throated Kingfisher, and etc.

We have an early start to the base of Maxwell Hill to take the first shuttle to the top of the hill. We spend the day birding. Potential Birds: Streaked Spiderhunter, Blue-winged Minla, Mountain Tailorbird, Black-throated Sunbird, Mountain Fluvetta, Black-browed Barbet, Lesser Racquet-tailed Drongo, White-throated Fantail, Streaked Wren Babbler, Sultan Tit, Blyth Hawk Eagle, Leafbird and others. Evening, we will depart back to Taiping hotel for overnight.

After breakfast, we continue our birding and by midday we journey to the base of Maxwell hill. After lunch and some needed rest we will head to



Kampong Cheah for more birds. Overnight in Taiping. Potential Birds: Raffles Malkoha, Golden Wisked Barbet, Buff-rumped Woodpecker, Black Tigh Falconet, Red-throated Barbet, Coppersmith Barbet, Forest Warbler, White-rumped Sharma, Thick-billed Spiderhunter and many others.

Today early morning, head towards to Kuala Gula for the shore birds and stop for lunch. After lunch, we travel to Sedim Canopy Walkway and continue on to take the last ferry to Langkawi. Overnight in Langkawi. Potential Birds: Stork-billed Kingfisher, Milky Stork, Wimbrell, Purple Heron, Blue-tailed Bee-eater, Pied Fantail, Ashy Tailorbird, Black-naped Oriole, Great Tit, Yellow-browed Warbler, Purple-rumped Sunbird, Great Egret and others.

In the morning, head to Kg. Kisap for scrubland birds. At midday we travel the various mud flats and paddies for the shore and wetland specialties. At the end of day we travel up Gunung Raya for the Wreathed and Great hornbills. Overnight in Langkawi. Potential Birds: Lesser Whistling Duck, Black-hooded Oriole, Red-wattled Lapwing, Brown-winged Kingfisher, Ashy Drongo, Brown Shrike, Oriental Pratincole, Purple Swampphen, Crane, Cinamon Bittern, Bulbul, Asian Brown Flycatcher, Cattle Egret, Hornbill and many others.

Spend the morning birding for rainforest birds and those target species that we did not get the day before. Potential Birds: Flowerpecker, Greater flame-backed Woodpecker, Asian Fairy Bluebird, Oriental Broadbill Roller, Blue Wistling Thrush, Hill Myna, Thick-billed Pegeon, Crested Serpent Eagle, Bhraminy Kite, Abbots Babbler, Jerdons Baza, Bee-eater, Brown-backed Needle-tailed swift, Pacific Swallow, Ocrachous Bulbul and many others.

Breakfast at staying hotel. Free at leisure till your departure transfer to Langkawi airport.

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The “Ring Ladies”

Who are the “Ring Ladies” in Sarawak?

The Ring ladies of Semban in Sarawak are the sub-tribe of Bidayuh Ethnic came from Semban Village which located at the Northeast of the island of Borneo, the state of Sarawak, Malaysia

They wear Copper coiled rings on their forearms and calves, these rings are called “RUYANG” which are used on their forearms and “RASUNG” which are used on their calves.

They started putting on their rings at a very young age, around 8 to 10 years old and will never take them off until they need to change it to bigger sizes.



It was believed that these copper rings came to become a symbol of status, so parents started to put these rings on their daughters to set them apart from the rest. The more coiled rings a girl had, the richer her family was, a symbol of wellness and prosperity.

Girls those days without rings would have difficulty in finding a husband, so even without parents forcing these rings on their daughters, young girls would succumb under social and peer pressures and eventually took to wearing the rings.
